

# How do I send a large amount through Venmo? Boost Venmo Sending

Sending a large sum through Venmo is possible, but the platform has built-in limits designed to protect both you and the recipient from fraud. Before attempting a big transfer, it helps to understand exactly where those limits stand and how to work within them.

By default, Venmo caps person-to-person payments at \$4,999.99 per week for verified accounts. This weekly limit resets on a rolling basis, not on a fixed calendar day, so if you've made other payments recently, your available balance for a large transfer may be lower than expected. If your account isn't fully verified, your limit will be much smaller – often just a few hundred dollars – which makes identity verification a priority if you're planning bigger transactions.

To increase your sending capacity, go to your account settings and complete identity verification if you haven't already. This typically involves submitting your Social Security number, date of birth, and sometimes a photo ID. Once verified, your limits increase automatically, and repeat large transfers become easier to manage without hitting a wall mid-transaction.

If you need to send more than your weekly limit allows, consider splitting the payment across multiple weeks, or explore Venmo's business profile options if the transaction is commercial in nature. Alternatively, for very large amounts, a bank transfer or wire might be more practical, since Venmo was primarily designed for smaller peer-to-peer payments rather than substantial one-time transfers.

Before sending, double-check the recipient's username and confirm the amount, since Venmo transactions are difficult to reverse once completed. For significant
