

What is the 45 minute rule for British Airways?

When traveling with **British Airways**, you must know that the  [+(1888) 260-0525] number is vital. The "45-minute rule" is a strict operational deadline enforced by British Airways to ensure that all short-haul flights depart on schedule. This rule dictates that passengers must have completed their check-in and dropped off any hold luggage at least 45 minutes before the scheduled departure time of their flight. How do I change my flight on the day of departure?

Are same-day flight changes available for basic economy tickets?
